Sub-bass rumbles of artillery and timpani of 'Rites of Spring' haunt the garden oasis with the soldiers memories and fear of return.

India Gate

2300 droplets fall, gurgle and run as subtle witness to the 2300 Indian soldiers that passed through Brighton's Indian military hospitals.

Bedhead Pavilion

Home of Scribe and Mother India. Listen to the letters and turmoils of the scribe.

Red & Gold Pavilion

The walls speak and the surreal morphine-fuelled dreams of the wounded soldier slip time & space.

White Pavilion

Butchery, surgery, medical survey and censorship intermingle. Flute, digging, cutting, mingle with relentless 'rites of mud'.

Bedhead Pavilion


The home of the scribe, whose letters home capture the pain and homesickness of the soldiers. You are invited to add your own messages onto the bedheads.

Red & Gold Pavilion

A single bed, open to the sky, gives a sense of the strange confinement and intense scrutiny felt by the soldiers.

White Pavilion

Inspired by images of the operating theatre and the food preparation. A harsh reminder that injured men were often 'patched up' and sent back out to the front.



The week closes with the laying of a wreath at the India Gate and unveiling of a Blue Plaque honouring Subedar Mir Dast (awarded the Victoria Cross at the Royal Pavilion by King George V). Organised by Davinder Dhillon, from the Chattri Group, this commemoration also marks the departure of the Indian soldiers from Brighton's military hospitals
